This advocacy organization represents the rights, interests, and needs of all Indigenous people living off-reserve on PEI. They provide a range of supports and services including shelters, mental health and addictions, family supports, housing supports, and employment programs. Last year, NCPEI opened a 10-bed, low-barrier men's homeless shelter in Summerside, which provides wraparound services to help clients address issues such as homelessness, mental health, and addictions. "We are currently hiring for the positions of Shelter Manager and Casual Shelter Resource Worker," says Mary-Lynn Blanchard, Human Resources.
